CMFSC CLASS OF 2026 GRADUATES MOVE FORWARD ACROSS NORTH AMERICA

Our club will see 22 players move forward into collegiate play across North America from the Class of 2026. This will rank amongst the top in British Columbia.

On the girls side; six players will be moving into NCAA division 1 play. Kaya Sather will fly over to New York to compete for the Colgate University Raiders. Aaliyah McDiarmid and Ashley Tan travel together to the Atlanta area for Kennesaw State. Allie Turnbull will move to the midwest to join Indiana State, while Ava Burdeyny drives down the I-5 highway to compete for Oregon State.
