



## **COQUITLAM METRO-FORD CLASS OF 2022 PLAYERS MAKE THEIR MOVES INTO COLLEGIATE PLAY**

Annually our club helps develop a large volume of players that move into collegiate play for universities and colleges across North America. This year fifteen of our BCSPL players have signed on to compete in post-secondary competition at campuses across Canada and into the US NCAA Div.1 system. Nine players from our U18 girls squad and six players from the boys squad will take the next step into the high performance levels of the collegiate game.

Lucy Von Stefenelli is bringing the BC flag with her to Louisville, Kentucky as she will be competing in the top-flight NCAA Div.1 league for the Bellarmine University Knights. Also travelling cross-country is Kaylee Downey who will represent the club at the University of Kings College in Halifax, Nova Scotia. The Blue Devils compete the CCAA Atlantic region.

Four of the U18 girls players will move into Canada's top league, U-Sports. Kylie Hendricks and Charis Wardrope will join the 2021 season national finalists, Trinity Western Spartans. Luciana Andrews and Kayla Tallarico will join their local rivals with the University of Fraser Valley Cascades. Three will move into the CCAA league as Jessica Fong and Jacqueline Reinhard will join multiple club alumni to compete with the Capilano University Blues and Vanessa Chung will commute in to be with the Douglas College Royals.

One of our U18 boys graduates will be heading across the provincial border into Alberta as goalkeeper Tegan Romaine will challenge for the starting position with the Pronghorns at the University of Lethbridge. Jordan Low will bring his talents to the always strong Trinity Western University Spartans who regularly move into the national play-off picture. Matteo Brazinha will be challenging the Spartans as he will help guide the University of Fraser Valley Cascades.

Three U18 boys will connect into the 2021 CCAA league national finalists at Douglas College. Joel Badger, Antonio Dorantes, and Behrad Hajimohammadi look to lead the Royals back into the CCAA play-offs and make another run for national title contention.
